EXHIBIT XVI. FACTS/INFORMATION SHEET

The following “after” photograph was taken approximately 1 ½ years ago (03/08/22) while Michael was housed at Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center (maximum security). By that time Michael had been told he was going to be transferred to a regional hospital (i.e. minimum security) at least 3 times over a span of 2 years. “Pack it up Mr. Kapneck, you’re being transferred! They’re here!... NO! you’re not going anymore...” Was it a cruel game? Or, was it a concession of genuine administrative errors? Of course, Mr. Kapneck was reasoned to believe the latter. And it was possible considering that Michael had never been violent or physically aggressive.

Additionally, had Michael been transferred (per his 1st “general population” doctors’ recommendation) he would have most likely never been placed in the seemingly never-ending chaos that followed (i.e. assaulted 5+ times, physically abused by staff, unjustifiably placed in a restraint chair/administered emergency medication).

*Please see Exhibit X. for the Disabilities Rights Maryland “Investigative Report” regarding Michaels one and only time ever being placed in restraint. Michael would have also been transferred prior to the pandemic and would have absolutely been reunited with his family by now. Including the following:

- His 87 yr. old “local” schizophrenic mother who desperately needs him.
- His 23 yr. old son who has been pining for his father for the past 6+ yrs.
- His 21 yr. old daughter (a cadet at The Naval Academy-Annapolis, Maryland) who he hopes to reestablish a relationship with.
- His 48 yr. old sister who lives in Colorado.
- His brother-in-law (Mr. Steven Winkler) who also lives locally and remains an integral part of Michaels support system.

* Additional friends/family business associates who are deeply concerned for his well-being.

Per Exhibit IV. (pg. 2 & 3 highlighted in yellow), Michael did make several attempts at connecting with community resources prior to his 2017 mental breakdown.

The reason the above information is so important is that it exemplifies Michaels attempted effort to reach out for help months prior to his psychotic break.

*It should also be noted that Michael was released from prison without being provided the psychiatric medication he had been taking for years. It is standard policy and procedure to provide prisoners with several months’ worth of medications (upon release) until community services are established.

For some reason, Michael’s medication was lost/misplaced. Michaels longtime friend/business associate and mother of his son, Ms. Nubia Henry, testified to the above at Michaels 2019 Conditional Release Hearing at Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center. In addition, Ms. Henry also testified that pre-trial services failed to act within a reasonable amount of time considering Michael’s deteriorating condition requests for help. As a last resort, Michael (with the help of Ms. Henry) attempted to obtain psychiatric medication through a “CVS Minute Clinic”. It was only then that they found out that mental health services are NOT offered, and unfortunately left without Michaels much needed bipolar medication. He finally deteriorated to the state noted in applicable reports, affecting as seen in the picture noted above.

*Per p. 20 of Exhibit VI (highlighted in yellow), CTPHC’s evaluator Rebecca Blood noted, “to a degree, this has been a failure of the system, not solely placed on Mr. Kapneck as a failure...”.

*For the record, Michal does not want to convey/project the failures (by community resources) as the total and complete cause of his breakdown. He wants it to be stated that he could have made other choices that very well may have resulted in a completely different outcome.

*Regardless of “blame” Michael has worked tirelessly with clinicians to regain his mental faculties and moral compass. Acknowledging that the bulk of the restoration came from within, Michael felt that the attached “AFTER” picture serves as a good visual aid to the countless hours spent (throughout the years) to show just how far he has actually come since his arrest in 2017.
