BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Mr. Kapneck, born [REDACTED] is a 47 years old Caucasian male with self reported childhood diagnosis of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Bipolar I disorder, most recent episode manic, with psychotic features, polysubstance use (cocaine, ecstasy, alcohol, opioids, benzodiazepine, cannabis) and antisocial and narcissistic personality traits admitted on July 23, 2019 to Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center (CTPHC) for the third time after he was found NOT CRIMINALLY RESPONSIBLE (NCR) in the Circuit Court for Montgomery County - Criminal System for charges ARMED ROBBERY two counts (135430C) on July 10, 2019, for crimes he had committed on November 27, 2017.

Kapneck was diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder in elementary school. In school, records indicated he received special education due to being a slow learner and difficulty focusing. At age 19, he overdosed in an attempted suicide and was hospitalized. He subsequently did not receive mental health treatment until 1995, around the age of 23.

The patient suffers from recurrent manic and psychotic symptoms. He has had multiple previous manic episodes, depressive episodes and suicide attempts. His manic episodes are characterized by expansive and irritable mood, increased activity and energy, severe insomnia where he could stay up for many days, racing thoughts, along with grandiose and paranoid delusions and auditory hallucinations. He had delusions about being
